**Carvers** – Please note there are two new silicate Carbide grinding wheels which have been installed. These new grinders are for your use when carving/shaping your larger pieces of material. Please do **not** use the diamond grinders.

## Safety Issues

Our recent gem show is a timely reminder that lifting produces muscle strain and soreness. Obviously we move boxes and drums of rock and books, pot plants, trestles, showcases, decorative displays and foodstuffs. Equally obvious is that collecting tasks often produce lifting hazards. Lifting can produce some very nasty injuries of long term or even a permanent nature, so belatedly, a note on lifting.

A text on OH&S describes lifting hazards (for one person) as any lift of 35 kg or more, a lift of 25kg repeated more than 10 times in a day, or repetition lifts of more than 25 times a day of 11.5kg either below knees or above shoulders or at arms length.

Risk minimisation involves evaluation of weight to be lifted, sharing the load, keeping good posture, warming up before beginning tasks, using lifting equipment as needed and available, and of course 'listening' to our bodies for signs of protest or weakness or fatigue.

Some of these lifting issues we will explore a little more fully in later articles, meanwhile 'WATCH YOUR BACK' (and other bits)

### Chef's Corner



#### ANZAC BISCUITS (makes about 35 biscuits)

##### Ingredients

- 1 cup rolled oats
- 1 cup plain flour
- 1 cup sugar
- $\frac{3}{4}$  cup coconut
- 125 gm butter
- 2 tblsp Golden syrup
- $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp bicarb soda
- 1 tblsp boiling water

##### Directions

- Combine oats, sifted flour, sugar and coconut.
- Combine butter and golden syrup over gentle heat until melted.
- Mix bicarb with boiling water then add to melted butter & syrup.
- Stir foaming mixture into dry ingredients.
- Grease an oven tray.
- Place 1 tblsp mixture per biscuit on tray (or roll out to flat 1cm thick then cut to shape) leave room for expansion
- Cook in slow oven (180) for about 20 minutes till golden.
- Cool on tray.

This is Colin's recipe and we have been eating/enjoying them for the last week or so.
